Please stop to ponder this danger: Today's technology is instant access to all kinds of sins! Here are 11 sins to flee

- 1. **Pride**: James 4:4–6 Technology can be used to fuel our greatest enemy within. We can hop online and are given an instant platform to speak without having proven character.
- 2. Idolatry: Ps 119:9–11 Have you considered your use of technology in light of Psalm 119?
- 3. Profanity: Eph 4:29 Do you post things online that you would be ashamed of saying Sunday morning at church?
- 4. **Workaholic**: Luke 12:16–21 Do you spend your time using technology to build up something that could be gone instantly and has little to no eternal value?
- 5. **Authority & Submission**: Rom 13:1–2 Children: Do you go to places online or download apps you know your parents have forbid you to go/use? Adults: Do you vent your frustrations online when things don't go your way?
- 6. Anger & Murder: Matt 5:21–24 You don't physically have to kill someone to be a murderer. Hatred kills!
- 7. **Lust**: 1 Thess 4:1–8; Matt 5:27–28 This is the seedbed of adultery. If you are looking at pornography as a Christian, there is NO ACCEPTABLE WAY in which God views this as ok.
- 8. Stealing: Eph 4:28 Taking what you have not earned or have a legitimate claim to
- 9. Lying: Eph 4:25 Do you present something about yourself that is not the complete picture?
- 10. **Lack of contentment**: 1 Cor 6:9–11 Where are you discontent in your life? Ask yourself how is my use of technology fueling that discontentment and causing me to run from Christ?
- 11. Laziness: Prov 6:9–11 Do you want everything handed to you or are unwilling to do anything about it yourself?

12 areas to consider about the character of your life as you interact with technology

- 1. Witness/Evangelism: When's the last time you fully/boldly shared the gospel online? And followed up on it?
- 2. Responsibility: Why do you want to quickly put yourself under the influence of the world?
- 3. **Popularity** Do you seek recognition, honor, or approval from men?
- 4. Shepherding Do you carefully tend to and care for God's sheep?
- 5. Influence Do you notice the world is trying to change your thinking about everything God stands for?
- 6. Warfare Which ways do you guard yourself from the world, and your own sins, when you use technology?
- 7. Wasted time Have you thought about how much time your technology is consuming from your life?
- 8. Finances Are you wisely using the resources God has allow you to have?
- 9. Accountability You think you can hide online but God will hold you accountable for everything you do
- 10. Distrust in God's sovereignty How do you respond when your technology breaks?
- 11. **Honesty**: Is your new life in Christ reflected in your use of technology?
- 12. Integrity Is what you do online consistent through every aspect of your life?

7 ways to slow down the onslaught and get back on track with God without having to shed all your technology

- 1. Trust in God's Word: The principles for all that I need to live a God honoring life are in scripture (2 Tim 3:16–17)
- 2. Repent of your sins: As sins are revealed, seek God's forgiveness as you turn from them (1 John 1:9)
- 3. Guard your thoughts Put up a biblical filter to sift out worldliness and sinful beliefs (Phil 4:8-9)
- 4. Walk in obedience One of the greatest witnesses to ourselves and the world is to obey God (1 John 2:3-6)
- 5. Find accountability God's design for the church is the inspired model for maturing (Eph 4:11–16)
- 6. Stay on guard Resist the schemes of the devil and stand firm (Eph 6:10–19)
- 7. Strive to Glorify Christ Pray for wisdom, trust God's sovereignty, and live to honor God (1 Cor 10:31)
