Isaiah 63 - 64 Sermon Outline Pastor Tom Zimbelman

Theme: The Day of the Lord and the Cry for Redemption

1. The Avenger Isaiah 63:1-6

- *The coming Redeemer emerges from Edom.*
- *He comes alone, mighty to save, clothed in judgment.*
- *Salvation and vengeance are inseparably joined in the Kinsman Redeemer.*
- *Either Christ bears our sin, or sin must be judged in us.*

2. God's Mercy Remembered Isaiah 63:7-14

- *Isaiah recalls the lovingkindness of the Lord.*
- *God was present with His people in their affliction.*
- *The Angel of His Presence redeemed and carried them.*
- *Rebellion grieved the Holy Spirit and broke fellowship.*
- *Remembering God's faithfulness leads toward repentance.*

3. Prayer of Penitence Isaiah 63:15-19

- *Israel cries out for God to look down from heaven.*
- *They acknowledge God as Father and Redeemer.*
- *They confess their wandering hearts and spiritual desolation.*
- *True humility brings honest repentance and dependence.*

4. Oh Lord, Come Down Isaiah 64:1-5

- *The people plead for God to rend the heavens and act.*
- *They long for a visible, unmistakable intervention.*
- *God alone acts for those who wait for Him.*
- *Salvation is needed because sin continues.*

5. Oh Lord, Cleanse Us Isaiah 64:6-12

- *Human righteousness is utterly insufficient.*
- *Sin carries people away like the wind.*
- *God must intervene as Father and Potter.*
- *Restoration depends on returning to Him.*

Scripture Cross References

Isaiah 63 - 64

Revelation 19:15: *“He Himself treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God.”*

Deuteronomy 7:10: *“And He repays those who hate Him to their face, to destroy them. He will not be slack with him who hates Him; He will repay him to his face.”*

Acts 9:4–5: *“Then he fell to the ground, and heard a voice saying to him, ‘Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?’ And he said, ‘Who are You, Lord?’ Then the Lord said, ‘I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting.’”*

John 14:9: *“Jesus said to him, ‘Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father.’”*

Colossians 1:15: *“He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.”*

Psalms 68:5: *“A father of the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in His holy habitation.”*

Exodus 22:22: *“You shall not afflict any widow or fatherless child.”*

Matthew 7:11: *“If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!”*

Micah 1:4: *“The mountains will melt under Him, and the valleys will split like wax before the fire, like waters poured down a steep place.”*

Isaiah 53:6: *“All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned, every one, to his own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.”*

1 Peter 2:25: *“For you were like sheep going astray, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.”*
