## Isaiah 60 Sermon Outline Pastor Tom Zimbelman

***Theme: Christ's Kingdom***

***Introduction***

***Isaiah 60 shows the world after judgment, after repentance, and after Christ takes His throne***

### ***1. Light shines on Zion Isaiah 60:1-7***

- ***The glory of the Lord rises upon Jerusalem***
- ***A stark contrast between global darkness and divine Light***
- ***The Lord Himself is present, reigning from Zion***
- ***Jerusalem becomes the visible center of hope for the world***

### ***2. Gentiles flock to Jerusalem Isaiah 60:8-18***

- ***Nations, kings, and peoples are drawn to the Light***
- ***Former enemies come in repentance and worship***
- ***Wealth and resources are brought to honor the Lord***
- ***Peace, righteousness, and security define Christ's kingdom***
- ***The promises to Abraham are fulfilled through faith in Christ***

### ***3. God's glory is the everlasting Light Isaiah 60:19-22***

- ***The Lord replaces the sun and moon as the source of Light***
- ***Mourning ends and righteousness prevails***
- ***God's people inherit the land forever***
- ***The Lord brings it to pass in His appointed time***

## **Scripture Cross References**

### **Isaiah 60**

**John 8:12:** *“I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life.”*

**Revelation 21:23:** *“The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it. The Lamb is its light.”*

**Galatians 3:16:** *“Now to Abraham and his Seed were the promises made. He does not say, ‘And to seeds,’ as of many, but as of one, ‘And to your Seed,’ who is Christ.”*

**Galatians 3:29:** *“And if you are Christ’s, then you are Abraham’s seed, and heirs according to the promise.”*

**Nehemiah 7:3:** *“Do not let the gates of Jerusalem be opened while the sun is hot; and while they stand guard, let them shut and bar the doors; and appoint guards from among the inhabitants of Jerusalem, one at his watch station and another in front of his own house.”*
