Giants of Compromise — Genesis 6:1–4

Scripture Reading

Genesis 6:1-4

1. Strange Giants in Scripture

Nephilim = giants, figures of terror and wickedness. Their presence shows how compromise creates chaos. Heaven + humanity = hellish results.

Reflection Question: What feels "giant-sized" in your life or community right now?

2. The Sons of God and Daughters of Humanity

Sons of God \rightarrow the faithful, committed, godly. Daughters of Humanity \rightarrow worldly, tempting, foreign entanglements. Their union produced compromise and destruction.

Reflection Question: What temptations or compromises do you wrestle with in your walk with God?

3. Giants We Produce Today

- When Christianity + greed = corruption
- When faith + flesh = compromise
- When sacred + secular = counterfeit worship
- When the called + careless = complacency
- When Christianity lies down with nationalism = oppression

Reflection Question: Which of these "giants" do you see most clearly in today's church or community?

4. The Giants Around Us

Church \rightarrow apathy, division, tradition without transformation.

Communities → poverty, prejudice, violence, injustice.

Families → brokenness, betrayal, cycles.

Neighborhoods \rightarrow drugs, despair, guns.

Workplaces \rightarrow exploitation, burnout, corruption.

 $Government \rightarrow greed, oppression, injustice. \\$

Hearts \rightarrow fear, doubt, pride, unforgiveness.

Reflection Question: Where do you see giants most clearly in your own circle of life?

5. The Good News: Giants Fall

Nephilim also means "to fall." Giants don't last forever. Pride falls. Corruption falls. Cycles fall. The bigger they are, the harder they fall.

Reflection Question: Which giant are you believing God to bring down in your life right now?

Application Points

- Stay alert: avoid compromise that leads to chaos.
- Identify the 'giants' around you name them.
- Trust God for victory: giants fall.
- Stand with faith, courage, and accountability.
