Deuteronomy 15:12-17

## **How Hebrews Became Bond Servants**

- 1. **Poverty**: A Hebrew could voluntarily sell themselves for service to another. (Exod. 21:2; Lev. 25:39)
- 2. Theft: A Hebrew could be sold to make restitution for a theft. (Ex. 22:3)
- 3. **Birth**: Those born to bond servants were born into servitude as a condition of their birth. (Ex. 21:4)
- 4. **Debt**: Debtors might be sold, by creditors, as a condition of their debt. (Lev. 25:39,47)
