Q1: What is fact-based joy?

A1: Fact-based joy is a settled happiness which rests on reasonable evidence that your current situation, though difficult, will ultimately improve. While psychological denial suppresses evidence, emotional experience fabricates evidence, and chemical infusion trivializes evidence, fact-based joy weighs the evidence.

Q2: Isn't happiness based on circumstances while joy is based on our trust in God?

A2: The Bible makes no distinction between joy, happiness, gladness, or cheerfulness. These are dependent on *all* of the circumstances (that which "stands around" you), immediate and ultimate.

Q3: What does the salutation of Philippians tell us about joy?

A3: Joy comes from serving the Lord Jesus Christ.
