God's Megaphone: Pain and Providence in the Book of Job

How To Help A Friend Who Suffers
Job 32–37
The Lord's Day Morning
April 19, 2020

Elihu's Contribution (32–37)

While Job's friends are certain God permits suffering to *punish* Job's *hidden* sin, Elihu recognizes that God permits suffering to *prevent* Job's *future* sin by disciplining him and correcting his course (33:14-28; 36:15). While Job's friends accuse him of sinning *before* he suffers, Elihu accuses Job of sinning *while* he suffers by complaining against God and accusing him of injustice (33:9–1; 34:35; 34:5,6;36:23 agrees with 38:2; 40:2,8). While Job's friends bring no evidence for their accusation, Elihu cites Job's own words "You say..." (Job 33:8-11; 33:13; 34:5,6; 35:2,3; 36:23). So Elihu seems to get closer to the truth, but he also seems to lack a loving and compassionate tone, perhaps the voice of youth and lack of experience in personal suffering.
