30	Jesus claimed equality with God and validated his claim by the
	resurrection (Jn. 5:18).
60	Paul affirms Jesus is fully God, the "firstborn of all creation" (Col. 1:15–
	20). As the "firstborn," Jesus is the uncreated supreme heir of the
	Father, sovereign over creation and the church.
90	John affirms that Jesus is fully God, "begotten," but not made (Jn. 1:18;
	3:16). As the "begotten" (monogenes), Jesus is the one-of-a-kind son, being
	infinite and eternal, with no beginning or end.
325	Council of Nicaea affirms that God is one being who exists as three
	distinct co-equal, co-eternal, and consubstantial persons. The Council
	denies Arius' teaching that Jesus is a created being.
381	Nicene Creed finalized at the First Council of Constantinople.
2025	Over 2.5 billion people on every inhabited continent profess belief in the
	truths confirmed in Nicaea 1700 years ago.
