Three kinds of Law in the Bible:

- 1. Moral: Permanent laws of love. Repeated in New Testament.
- 2. Civil: Temporary laws to govern Israel. Repealed in New Testament.
- 3. **Ceremonial**: Temporary ceremonies to foreshadow Christ. Repealed in New Testament.

3.	as safety net for the poorest of the poor (21:2b).
4. 12:	44; 23:12).
5.	of six years followed by generous compensation or voluntary extension (Ex. 21:2c–6; Dt. 15:12–18).
6.	from abusive masters (21:7–11; 26–27).
7.	with potential for exploitation, so Scripture subversively sows the seeds of abolishing all slavery and the conditions that foster it (Dt. 15:15; Ex. Col. 3:9–11; 4:1).
