104	Happy	Praise Psalm	I will sing to the King!
42	Sad	Lament Psalm	Following Jesus does not guarantee an easy life.
32	Sin	Confessional Psalm	Even if we disobey and deny our King, there is a way back to him.
69	Mad	Imprecatory Psalm	If we are faithful to King Jesus, his enemies will be ours.
118	Grateful	Thanksgiving Psalm	Our King's good gifts fill our hearts with thanks.
150	Celebrate	Praise Psalm	Only our victorious King is worthy of our praise and worship.

The Psalms are arranged in a way that illustrates the progress of a Christ-follower, from the initial decision to follow Christ (Psalm 1), through the ups and downs of adversity to the victorious end guaranteed by Christ's resurrection (Psalm 150).
