The Christian Political Ethic: Loving our neighbors by recognizing the separate functions of church and state, honoring all public officials, obeying all just laws, and engaging in the political process for the common good.

- 1. The function of the church: To glorify God by helping people know, love, obey, and exalt Jesus Christ.
- 2. The function of the state: To maintain a just peace by impartially punishing those who do evil and praising those who do good.
- 3. The honor due to officials: Respect for someone made in the image of God and ordained by God to use power to serve others.
- 4. The obedience required of Christians: Lovingly obey all human laws that harmonize with God's laws and respectfully disobey all human laws that contradict God's laws.
- 5. The political engagement of Christians: Use God-entrusted power to promote the impartial protection of all people under the law.
