1 Timothy 3:1–13 The Lord's Day Morning March 19, 2023

God expects his family to be served by qualified leaders who are above reproach. To be "above reproach" doesn't mean you never sin. It means that you are so sensitive to the loving rebuke and correction of God, that you repent of private sin that God sees before it leads to public sin that people see (1 Sam. 16:7; Pr. 15:3; Heb. 12:6; Mt. 6:6). Public sin damages the credibility of the man and the church he represents. By the grace of God, all believers can become the person described in this list of character traits. Here are the seven main areas in which all believers should strive to be above reproach:
