What Gethsemane Tells Us About God's Will

- 1. God's secret will of decree: **What shall be!** What God has decided he will do, which will infallibly come to pass. It is God's decreed will to permit sin and cause that sin to work toward the fulfillment of his good plan even when it is not clear to us how this could be.
- 2. God's revealed will of command: **What should be!** What we know God decided he wants us to do, which often does not come to pass (i.e., love God and others, the Ten Commandments). Therefore, God often permits in his hidden, decreed will, what he forbids in his revealed, commanded (moral) will. He daily permits what does not please him.
