"The disciple "whom Jesus loved" was part of the inner circle of disciples and was closely related to Peter. The synoptic Gospels name this inner circle as Peter, James, and John. Since Peter is separate from the beloved disciple, only James and John are left. James was martyred too early to be the disciple (Acts 12:1-2), so the apostle John was the author of the gospel." (Wilkinson, Bruce & Boa, Kenneth, Walk Thru the Bible, Thomas Nelson Publ., p. 337)

Humility in Authorship:

1.	All through John's gospel he never to himself by name.
2.	John's insistence on referring to himself as "The disciple whom Jesus loved" does not mean Jesus only him.
3.	John's title for himself demonstrated not egotism, but his humility by himself with the love of Jesus.
Humility in Service:
