Last week, we saw the good work of Jehosheba, *The Preacher's Wife Who Rescued Christmas*. Today, we see how her husband, Jehoiada the High Priest brought Jehosheba's rescue of the Davidic King to the restoration of the throne.

Jehoiada's Seven Steps Out of the Mess

- 1. He cut a covenant with the royal guard (11:4–8).
- 2. He crowned Joash, the son of David (11:9–12).
- 3. He cut Queen Athalia and her cabinet for multiple capital crimes (11:13–16).
- 4. He cut a covenant between the Lord, King Joash, and the people (11:17).
- 5. He cleansed Judah of idolatry that destroyed love and promoted injustice (11:18).
- 6. He consecrated 7-year old King Joash on the throne (11:19–20).
- 7. He catechized King Joash in the Word of God (12:1–3).

The Role of "Nevertheless" In Calm-Crisis Cycle of 1 and 2 Kings

- 1. Calm: God's perfect peace maintained by loving God and our neighbor.
- 2. Their Nevertheless: Selfish rebellion in response to God's kindness.
- 3. Crisis: God's righteous wrath that punishes unloving injustice.
- 4. God's Nevertheless: God's free forgiveness for all who repent and believe.
