Scripture & Discussion

Read: Genesis 2:22-25

Discuss:

- 1. There is the emotional, spiritual, and physical components that make up relationships. There must be a unity of the 3. Of the 3, which can you grow in your relationship with your spouse/significant other? If you are single, which of these still play a factor in your friendships?
- 2. The Hebrew word form for "to become one" is active and ongoing. It has no end. What implications does this truth have in our lives today?

Discuss

- 3. The husband is affirming his wife through his words. How have words affected you? When have they uplifted you? When have they hurt you?
- 4. Our lives are to be full of grace and truth. How can you show grace and truth to those that you do not see eye to eye with on beliefs of sex/sexuality?
- 5. His words are tender, passionate, and secure. What are ways to show tenderness, passion, and security in our marriage/relationships?

Prayer

This week pray that each person in your group would have an open heart during this series and that they would be aware of what God wants to speak to them.

Next Steps

We are all coming from different places: some of us are single, others of us are dating, some are married, and others are divorced. Identify one thing from the sermon and this week's discussion that applies to your season of life and actively work on it this week.
