# Money On My Mind

# **Start Talking**

Have you ever made a major purchase without telling your spouse? What was it and how did it go?

When we make a significant purchase why do we feel certain emotions?

#### Main Idea

We are starting a new series this week called "Money On My Mind". Money is one of the most frequent topics in all of the Bible. God understands that money often competes for the allegiance of our hearts because of the false sense of security, status, and importance that only He can truly provide. Money is neither good nor bad, but our relationship to it is the heart of the matter. It is often an accurate reflection of our values and priorities. Satan often uses it as a wedge between us and God and each other. Statistics overwhelmingly indicate that people struggle with money: 67% live paycheck-to-paycheck, 30% live in "crisis mode", and over 80% of 18-43-year-olds say it is a "significant" source of stress in their lives. The data indicates that doing what the world does is not working. So, what does God have to say about money? It's about time we ask! Jesus wants to save us from our sins AND transform us from old patterns of thinking and living. Let's tune in together for the next 4 weeks and hear what God has to say about Money On My Mind!

#### Personalize It

- What does the world say that money can do for you? How well does it deliver on those promises?
- 2. If God doesn't need our finances, then why does He talk about money so much in scripture? Why are people (we?) reluctant to trust God with our money?
- 3. The child in the video was given the choice between \$10,000 cash or 2 Oreos right out of the box. It was hard to believe he chose the Oreos! Or was it? What did that example mean and how do we "choose the Oreos" in our own lives? Are there areas in your life where your long-term goals struggle to align with your short-term behaviors?
- 4. Where are you on the flow chart of 4 Steps to Lasting Change: desire, deep conviction to change (sick and tired), a plan to follow, support & accountability? What is your next step?
- 5. What do you truly desire in your financial life? How well does it align with God's desire for it?

# Let's Do It! Commit to a step and live it out this week!

Adopt one of this week's scripture passages below. Write it down and put it where you will see it
when you spend money—in your wallet or purse, on your credit card, at your computer, etc. Let
scripture and prayer guide you as you make financial decisions this week, and share your
experience with the group next week.

- 2. Whenever worry or stress over finances creeps in this week, close your eyes, hold your arms out, and clench your fists. Then, after 20-30 seconds, slowly open your hands. As you feel the physical pressure release, give God your worry and stress through a quick prayer, telling him and reminding yourself that you trust Him again. Repeat as needed.
- 3. Are you on track with your savings? Is your discretionary spending under control? Do you have a plan to get out of debt? Are you able to be as generous as want to be? Make time to sit down with your spouse this week (or alone if single) and discuss how you are doing financially. If you are not where you want to be, commit now to joining a Financial Peace University class at Cypress next semester because money can be a wonderful servant, but it makes a terrible master.
