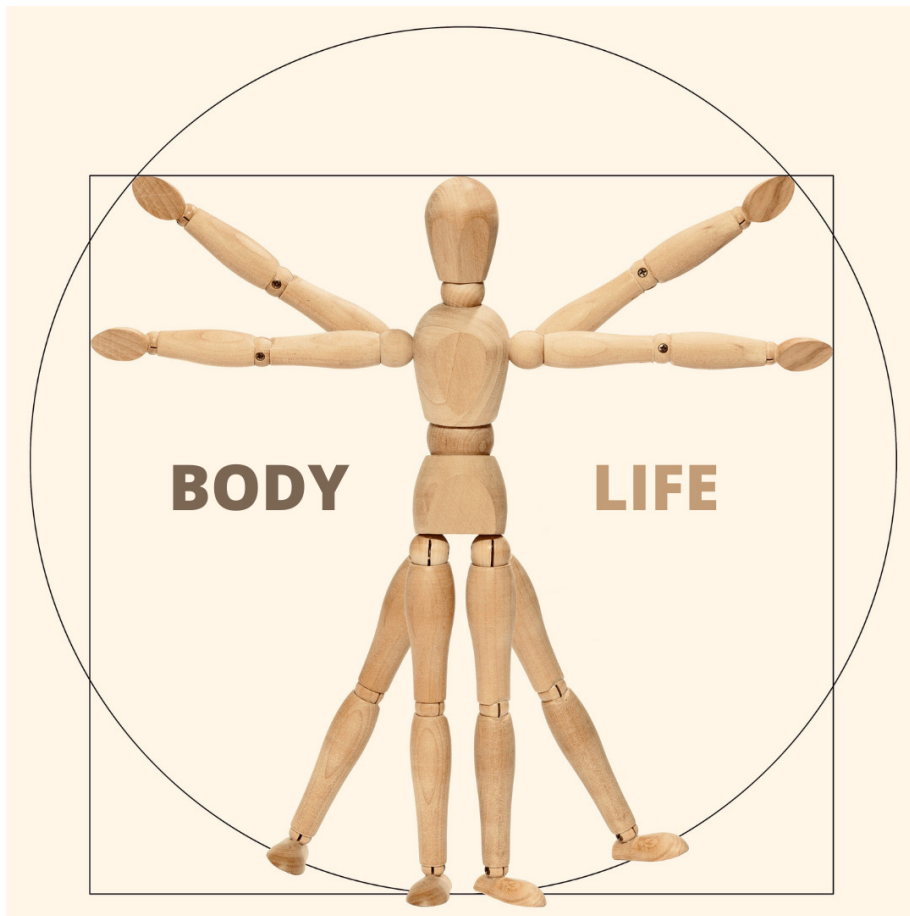

The Lessons

Please be seated for the readings from the Bible.

READER: *A reading from Paul's letter to the Ephesians.*

EPHESIANS 4: 1-16

¹ I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. ⁴ There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call— ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. ⁷ But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. ⁸ Therefore it says,

“When he ascended on high he led a host of captives,
and he gave gifts to men.”

⁹ (In saying, “He ascended,” what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower regions, the earth? ¹⁰ He

who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.) ¹¹ And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, ¹² to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, ¹⁴ so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. ¹⁵ Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

READER: *The Word of the Lord.*

PEOPLE: **Thanks be to God.**

PSALM 90:1-12

¹ Lord, you have been our refuge *
from one generation to another.

² Before the mountains were brought forth, or the earth and the world were made, *
you are God from everlasting, and world without end.

³ You turn man back to the dust; *
you say, "Return, O children of men."

⁴ For a thousand years in your sight are as yesterday, *
even as a day that is past.

⁵ You scatter them as a night-watch that comes quickly to an end; *
they are even as a dream and fade away.

⁶ They are like the grass, which in the morning is green, *
but in the evening is dried up and withered.

⁷ For we consume away in your displeasure *
and are afraid at your wrathful indignation.

⁸ You have set our misdeeds before you, *
and our secret sins in the light of your countenance.

⁹ For when you are angry, all our days are gone; *
we bring our years to an end, as a tale that is told.

¹⁰ The days of our life are seventy years, and though some
be so strong that they come to eighty years, *
yet is their span but labor and sorrow; so soon it passes away, and we are gone.

¹¹ But who regards the power of your wrath, *
and who considers the fierceness of your anger?

¹² So teach us to number our days, *
that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom.

ALLELUIA

Please stand for the Gospel reading.

READER: *The holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke.*

PEOPLE: **Glory to You, Lord Christ.**

LUKE 2:41-52

⁴¹ Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover.

⁴² And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to custom. ⁴³

And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, ⁴⁴ but supposing him to be in the group they went a day's journey, but then they began to search for him among their relatives and acquaintances, ⁴⁵ and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for him. ⁴⁶ After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷ And all who heard him were amazed at his understand-

ing and his answers. ⁴⁸ And when his parents saw him, they were astonished. And his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been searching for you in great distress." ⁴⁹ And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" ⁵⁰ And they did not understand the saying that he spoke to them. ⁵¹ And he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was submissive to them. And his mother treasured up all these things in her heart.

⁵² And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man.

READER: *The Gospel of the Lord.*

PEOPLE: **Praise to You, Lord Christ.**

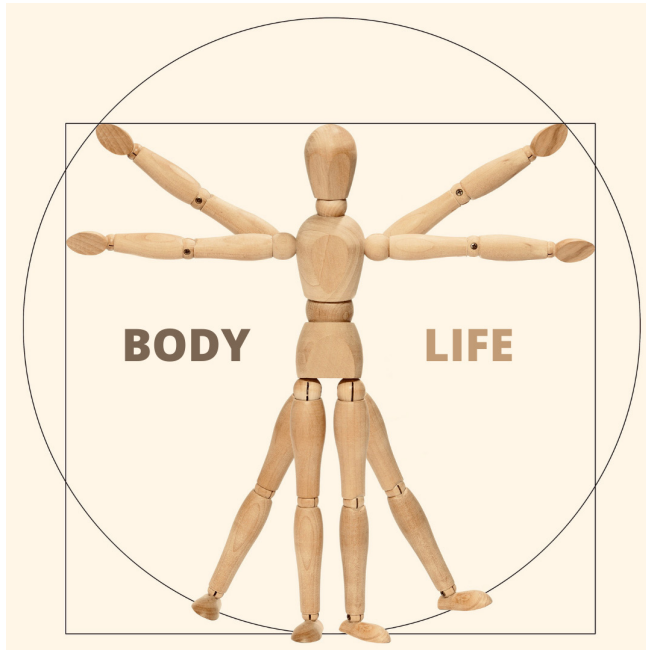
