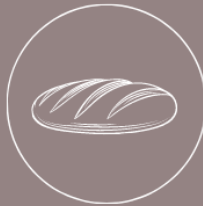
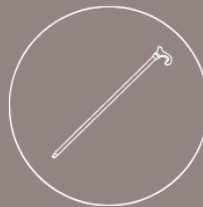

PEOPLE: **Amen.**

The Lessons

Please be seated for the readings from the Bible.

READER: *A reading from the prophet Isaiah.*

ISAIAH 57:14-21

- ¹⁴ And it shall be said,
“Build up, build up, prepare the way,
remove every obstruction from my people's way.”
- ¹⁵ For thus says the One who is high and lifted up,
who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy:
“I dwell in the high and holy place,
and also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit,
to revive the spirit of the lowly,
and to revive the heart of the contrite.
- ¹⁶ For I will not contend forever,
nor will I always be angry;
for the spirit would grow faint before me,
and the breath of life that I made.
- ¹⁷ Because of the iniquity of his unjust gain I was angry,
I struck him; I hid my face and was angry,
but he went on backsliding in the way of his own heart.
- ¹⁸ I have seen his ways, but I will heal him;
I will lead him and restore comfort to him and his mourners,
¹⁹ creating the fruit of the lips.
Peace, peace, to the far and to the near,” says the Lord,
“and I will heal him.
- ²⁰ But the wicked are like the tossing sea;
for it cannot be quiet,
and its waters toss up mire and dirt.
- ²¹ There is no peace,” says my God, “for the wicked.”

READER: *The Word of the Lord.*

PEOPLE: **Thanks be to God.**

PSALM 113

- ¹ Praise the Lord. Sing praises, you servants of the Lord; *
O praise the Name of the Lord.
- ² Blessed be the Name of the Lord, *
from this time forth for evermore.
- ³ The Lord's Name be praised *
from the rising up of the sun to the going down of the same.
- ⁴ The Lord is high above all nations, *
and his glory above the heavens.
- ⁵ Who is like the Lord our God, who has his dwelling so high, *
and yet humbles himself to behold the things that are in heaven
and earth?
- ⁶ He takes up the lowly out of the dust, *
and lifts the poor out of the ashes,
- ⁷ That he may set them with the princes, *
even with the princes of his people.
- ⁸ He gives the barren woman a home to dwell in, *
and makes her to be a joyful mother of children. Praise the Lord.

READER: *The holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to John.*

PEOPLE: **Glory to You, Lord Christ.**

JOHN 5:1-18

⁵ After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

² Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Aramaic called Bethesda, which has five roofed colonnades. ³ In these lay a multitude of invalids—blind, lame, and paralyzed. ⁵ One man was there who had been an invalid for thirty-eight years. ⁶ When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had already been there a long time, he said to him, “Do you want to be healed?”

⁷ The sick man answered him, “Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, and while I am going another steps down before me.” ⁸ Jesus said to him, “Get up, take up your bed, and walk.” ⁹ And at once the man was healed, and he took up his bed and walked.

Now that day was the Sabbath. ¹⁰ So the Jews said to the man who had been healed, “It is the Sabbath, and it is not lawful for you to take up your bed.”

READER: *The Gospel of the Lord.*

PEOPLE: **Praise to You, Lord Christ.**

¹¹ But he answered them, “The man who healed me, that man said to me, ‘Take up your bed, and walk.’” ¹² They asked him, “Who is the man who said to you, ‘Take up your bed and walk?’” ¹³ Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in the place. ¹⁴ Afterward Jesus found him in the temple and said to him, “See, you are well! Sin no more, that nothing worse may happen to you.” ¹⁵ The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him. ¹⁶ And this was why the Jews were persecuting Jesus, because he was doing these things on the Sabbath. ¹⁷ But Jesus answered them, “My Father is working until now, and I am working.”

¹⁸ This was why the Jews were seeking all the more to kill him, because not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God.
