3. In verses 8-12, Paul twice says he is not ashamed. What is he not ashamed of and why? What does He entrust to the Lord? How does this challenge or encourage you?
4. What are you told to guard and retain in verses thirteen and fourteen?
5. Which part of this chapter is most impactful to you?

## DAY 2

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 2. What three roles does Paul compare our Christian service to in verses 2-6, and with which one do you most identify?
2. Though Paul is in prison, what does he say about the word of God in verse nine, and why is he willing to endure such treatment, according to verse ten? What challenge does this pose to you?
3. What are you to be diligent about, according to verse fifteen? Practically speaking, how can you do this?
4. Paul gives some qualifications for being useful to the Lord in verses 20-26. What are they? Which is most difficult for you, and why?
5. Which part of this chapter is most impactful to you?

## DAY 3

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 3. Paul describes the character of false believers and false teachers. What does he say of them in verse five, and what does this verse mean? What are you to do with such people?
  2. What does Paul say is inevitable in verse twelve? What forms could that take in the United States? How might that look in other countries?
  3. In the face of opposition, what is Timothy instructed to do in verse fourteen?
  4. How does Paul describe Scripture in verses 16-17, and what does it equip you for? How have you seen this to be true?
  5. Which part of this chapter is most impactful to you?

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 4. What does Paul charge us with in verse two? Why is this important in light of verse three?
2. What does Paul say of himself in verses 7-8, and how can you live your life so that, at the end of it, you will be able to say the same?
3. What did God strengthen Paul to do in verse seventeen, and what does this tell you about the importance of this task? How are you engaging in this same task in your daily life?
4. Which part of this chapter is most impactful to you?

## DAY 5

1. What is one thing you have been challenged or convicted by in the study of 2 Timothy?
2. How have Paul and Timothy's lives encouraged you as a believer?
3. Timothy is Paul's final charge to Timothy before he is executed. If you were to give a "final charge" to those you love, what would you say?
4. To what extent are you living your own life according to the words you wrote above? How can you be more deliberate about doing so?
