



WEEK ELEVEN

1 TIMOTHY 6:11-16

DAY 1

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 1 Timothy 6:11-16. In verse eleven, Paul tells Timothy to flee from "these things." Which things is he calling Timothy to flee from? (See verses nine and ten).

2. What else does Scripture call us to flee from in 1 Corinthians 6:18-20, 1 Corinthians 10:14, 2 Timothy 2:22, and 1 Peter 3:10?

3. As we flee from sin, what does 1 Timothy 6:11 call us to pursue?

4. What else does Scripture call us to pursue or seek after in Romans 14:19, 1 Thessalonians 5:15, Hebrews 12:14, and 1 Peter 3:10-11?

5. Read Romans 6:12-13. What do these verses teach about how believers should relate to sin (what we flee) and to righteousness (what we pursue)? How can you apply this truth to your own life?

6. Write out this week's memory verse on a notecard or a piece of paper, and post it somewhere you will see it often (e.g., bathroom mirror, car, desk, kitchen sink, etc.).

Scripture Memory:

"But flee from these things, you man of God, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, perseverance, and gentleness. Fight the good fight of faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called, and you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses."

DAY 2

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 1 Timothy 6:11-16. What does Paul instruct Timothy to do in verse twelve?
2. In regard to our faith and living a godly life, what do we fight for? What do we fight against?
3. How do Romans 7:14-25 and Ephesians 6:12 describe the things we fight against?
4. How do Romans 5:12-14 and Ephesians 6:10-18 instruct us to engage the fight?

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 1 Timothy 6:11-16. What does verse twelve instruct us to take hold of?
 2. How, according to John 3:16-17 and John 3:36, can you be sure you have laid hold of eternal life?
 3. To whom, according to verse thirteen, did Jesus make a good confession?
 4. What was Pontius Pilate's position, according to Luke 3:1?
 5. What is the good confession Jesus made to Pilate in John 18:33-38?

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DAY 4

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 1 Timothy 6:11-16. How does verse fourteen instruct us to keep the commandment of God?
2. What event does 2 Peter 3:10 describe?
3. How should we anticipate this day, according to 2 Peter 3:12-13?
4. Knowing that the Lord will one day return, how does 2 Peter 3:11 & 14 call us to live?
5. How well do you keep the command of the Lord without stain or reproach? Is there an area of your life the Lord is convicting you to change? How can you walk in obedience in that area?
6. Write out this week's memory verse below:

DAY 5

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 1 Timothy 6:11-16. How do verses fifteen and sixteen describe the Lord?
 2. Revelation 5:11-14 describes a scene in heaven. What is happening, and what is being declared?
 3. Psalm 104 declares the grandeur, power, and faithfulness of the Lord in various ways. Which are most impactful to you?
