DAY 1

1. Begin your study time with prayer.
2. The role of a prophet was a very important one in Scripture. Who was responsible to appoint a prophet according to Deuteronomy 18:15 & 18, and Amos 2:11?
3. What were the prophets responsible to speak in Jeremiah 1:7 and 2 Peter 1:20-21?
4. What is one of the ways the Lord spoke to the prophets in Numbers 12:6?
5. What was the consequence for a prophet who spoke of his own volition in Deuteronomy 18:20?
6. What was the test to determine whether a prophet spoke for God in Deuteronomy 18:21-22?
7. Write out this week's memory verse on a notecard or a piece of paper, and post it somewhere you will see it often (e.g bathroom mirror, car, desk, kitchen sink, etc.).

DAY 2

1. Begin your study time with prayer. While God raised up true prophets, there were also numerous false prophets. What messages do false prophets carry according to Jeremiah 14:14, 23:16-17, 30-32?
2. What do Jeremiah 23:1-2, 23:25-27, and Matthew 24:11 say is the effect a false prophet has?
3. Another means of determining whether a prophet was genuine or false was to examine his character. How is their character described in Jeremiah 6:13, 23:13-14, Matthew 7:15, and 2 Peter 2:1-3 & 12-19?
4. False prophets are active today just as at any other time. They speak words of their own imagination and not those the Lord has commanded them to speak. Why is it dangerous to listen to a false prophet, and how can you determine whether someone is speaking for the Lord or of their own volition?
