Why we are devoted to one another?

The disciples devoted themselves to the apostles teaching, indicating a deep commitment to learning from those who had walked with Jesus.

The emphasis on teaching underscores the importance of biblical instruction in the life of the church.

The community also shared meals together, likely to include the Lord's Supper, as a symbol of their unity and fellowship.

Breaking bread together was a regular practice, demonstrating the value of worship and shared life.

The believers were continually devoting themselves to prayer, a habit that fostered a sense of awe and reverence for God. This prayer life was accompanied by miracles, as the apostles' performed wonders and signs while these miracles were a manifestation of God's power, they also served as a catalyst for the community's growth and unity.

As we consider this passage, we're reminded of the importance of prioritizing instruction from God's Word and seeking guidance from mature believers. Fellowship regularly together with fellow believers, sharing meals, and celebrating the Lord's Supper. Praying to cultivate a habit of prayer, seeking God's guidance, and expressing gratitude for His blessings.

Embrace a spirit of selflessness and generosity, and be willing to share resources and talents with one another.

Maintain a sense of wonder and reverence for God's presence and power in our lives.
