DAY 1

1. Begin your study time with prayer.
2. Read Exodus 15:22-23. What problem does Israel face, and how long had they been journeying?
3. When the people couldn't find fresh water, how did they react in Exodus 15:24?
4. What does Moses do in Exodus 15:25, and what does the Lord command the people in Exodus 15:26?
5. In Exodus 16:1-3 what do the people again do, and why? What do they wish instead?
6. What does God do for the Israelites in Exodus 16:4-21?
7. Write out this week's memory verse on a notecard or a piece of paper, and post it somewhere you will see it often (e.g bathroom mirror, car, desk, kitchen sink, etc.).

DAY 2

1. Begin your study time with prayer.
2. What happens again in Exodus 17:1-3, and how do the people react?
3. What does the Lord do for the Israelites in Exodus 17:4-7?
4. What do the Israelites complain about in Numbers 11:1-6?
5. What is God's reaction to their complaining in Numbers 11:10, and what is the result in Numbers 11:18-20 and 31-35?
6. Write out this week's memory verse below:

DAY 3

1. Begin your study time with prayer.
 2. In Exodus 19 the Lord calls Moses up to Mount Sinai to give him the Law. What do the Israelites do when Moses' return is delayed in Exodus 32:1-6? Why do they do this?
 3. How does Moses react in Exodus 32:19-20?
 4. Read Exodus 32:21-29. What decision does Moses tell the people to make, and what happens to those who will not?
 5. What does Moses do in Exodus 32:30-35, and what is the consequence from the Lord to the Israelites for their idolatry? What insight does this give you about how seriously the Lord takes idolatry?

DAY 4

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read Numbers 13:1-3. What does the Lord command?
2. What does Moses want the spies to discover in Numbers 13:17-20, and what was their report in Numbers 11:25-33?
3. How do the people react to this information in Numbers 14:1-10?
4. What is the consequence to the people for their rebellion and unbelief in Numbers 14:20-38?
5. Write out this week's memory verse below:

DAY 5

1. Begin your study time with prayer.
 2. Much of the Israelites' time in the wilderness is marked by complaining. While they complain to Moses, who does the Lord actually say they are grumbling against in Exodus 16:7-8 and Numbers 14:26-27?
 3. As the people complain, what does Numbers 11:4 say that they have? How is complaining a byproduct of this heart motive?
 4. Numbers 11:1 says the people "became like those who complain of adversity," and they begin to question the character and motive of God. What do they assume His motives are in Exodus 16:3, 17:3 & 7, and Numbers 14:3? How does adversity cause us to do the same? What negative things do we assume about God in difficulty?
 5. What does Philippians 2:14-15 command, and why is this important?
