

Who is Christ

This week Colossians 1:15-20 presents a profound declaration of Christ's supremacy-not just over humanity, but over all creation, redemption, and the cosmos itself. These passages reveal Jesus as the image of the invisible God, the eternal Son through whom all things were created, sustained, and reconciled.

- *He is the image of the invisible God: Jesus fully reveals God's nature, character, and glory.*
- *He's the firstborn of all creation: He holds supreme authority and preeminence over all creation.*
- *All things were created through Him and for Him: The universe, both visible and invisible-including spiritual powers-exists by His design and purpose.*
- *He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together: Christ is not only the Creator but the sustainer of reality, maintaining cosmic order.*
- *He is the head of the church: The body of believers is united under His leadership and life.*
- *He is the firstborn from the dead: His resurrection is the first fruits of a future resurrection for all who belong to Him.*
- *In Him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell: Jesus is not merely a representative of God-He is God in bodily form.*
- *Through Him, all things are reconciled: By the blood of His cross, Jesus makes peace between God and humanity, restoring broken relationships across creation.*

This passage is not just theological doctrine-it is a devotional call to worship Christ as Lord of all. In a world filled with competing claims, distractions, and false saviors, this passage reminds us: Jesus is first in everything. He is the source, sustainer, and goal of all things.


Let this truth shape your life:


