WEEK FOUR

2 TIMOTHY 2:8-13

DAY 1

1. Begin your study time with prayer.
2. Read 2 Timothy 2:8-13. What are you told to remember in verse eight? Why do you think this is significant?
3. How did the Jewish chief priests react to the report that Jesus had risen from the dead in Matthew 28:11-15?
4. When the disciples were told Jesus had risen from the dead, what was their reaction in Mark 16:9-13 and Luke 24:1-11?
5. What is Jesus' rebuke to His disciples in Mark 16:14 and Luke 24:15-26?
6. What is the importance of the resurrection according to 1 Corinthians 15:12-19?
7. Write out this week's memory verse on a notecard or a piece of paper, and post it somewhere you will see it often (e.g., bathroom mirror, car, desk, kitchen sink, etc.).

DAY 2

1. Begin your study time with prayer. In 2 Timothy 2:8, what else is Timothy instructed to remember?
2. What clues are contained in the Old Testament prophecies about the Messiah in Genesis 49:10, Micah 5:2, Jeremiah 33:14-17, and Jeremiah 23:5-6?
3. Jesus' lineage is recounted in Matthew 1:1-17 and Luke 3:23-38. Notice who is mentioned in Matthew 1:6, and Luke 3:31. How is Jesus' father, Joseph, addressed in Matthew 1:20?
4. How is Jesus addressed in Matthew 1:1, 15:22, Matthew 21:6-9, and Luke 18:35-39? How does Jesus refer to Himself in Revelation 22:16?
5. Why, according to John 7:42, is Jesus' lineage important?
6. Write out this week's memory verse below:

DAY 3

1. Begin your study time with prayer. Read 2 Timothy 2:8-13. What hardship is Paul experiencing in verse nine? What is stated about the Word of God?
 2. Read Philippians 1:12-18. What impact did his past imprisonment have on the furtherance of the gospel?
 3. Read Ephesians 6:19-20. What did Paul ask fellow believers to pray on his behalf?
 4. In 2 Timothy 2:10, why is Paul willing to endure all things, even imprisonment? To what extent do you agree or disagree with this conviction?
 5. Write out this week's memory verse below:

DAY 4

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 2:8-13. What trustworthy statement is written in verse eleven?
2. How do Romans 6:3-10 and 2 Corinthians 5:14 explain the process by which we “die” with Christ? When did you entrust your life to Christ? If you have not yet done so, what prevents you from surrendering to Christ?
3. In the first part of 2 Timothy 2:12, who is it that reigns with Christ?
4. Endurance suggests the presence of hardship or delay, or something that challenges our strength over time. What does David ask the Lord to renew in him in Psalm 51:10? If you are weary in an area of your life, ask the Lord to do the same for you.

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 2:8-13. What does verse twelve say happens to those who deny the Lord?
 2. According to Matthew 10:32-33, before whom will Jesus deny us if we deny Him?
 3. Who is granted eternal life in John 3:36, and what is the result for those who have denied Christ in Matthew 7:22-23 and Matthew 25:41?
 4. What promise is written in 2 Timothy 2:13? How does this encourage your soul?
