JERICHO AND RAHAB

DAY 1

1. Begin your study time with prayer and read Deuteronomy 2:7. How long had the people of Israel been in the wilderness and how does this verse describe God's care of them?
2. The people of Israel wandered in the wilderness until who had perished, according to Deuteronomy 2:14-16?
3. Moses is old and about to die. Who does he commission to lead the people after him in Deuteronomy 31:1-3 & 23?
4. Remember that Joshua was among the twelve men who originally spied out the land of Canaan. Why, according to Numbers 32:11-12, was Joshua (and Caleb) allowed to live while the other men perished in the wilderness?
5. How else does the Bible describe Joshua in Numbers 27:18 and Deuteronomy 34:9?
6. Write out this week's memory verse on a notecard or a piece of paper, and post it somewhere you will see it often (e.g bathroom mirror, car, desk, kitchen sink, etc.).

DAY 2

1. Begin your study time with prayer. How does the Bible describe the number of Israelites in Deuteronomy 10:22, and how does this fulfill the promise He made to Abraham in Genesis 15:5?
2. What did God say He would do for the Israelites as they entered the land of Canaan (the Promised Land) in Deuteronomy 2:25 and 9:1-3?
3. Read Joshua 1:1-6. God has promised to give the Israelites every place on which the soles of their feet tread. As they prepare to conquer and possess the Promised Land, what does God command them in verse six? Why do you think He says this?
4. In addition to being strong and courageous, what else does God caution them to do in Joshua 1:7-9. How is this same counsel useful to us today?
5. Write out this week's memory verse below:

DAY 3

1. Begin your study time with prayer. What does Hebrews 11:30 say happened by faith?
 2. What does Joshua do in Joshua 2:1 and what city is mentioned by name?
 3. Whose house do they go to and what happens in Joshua 2:1-7?
 4. Why does Rahab hide the spies in Joshua 2:8-11?
 5. What request does Rahab make of the spies in Joshua 2:12-21, and what do the spies tell her to do?
 6. Write out this week's memory verse below:
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DAY 4

1. Begin your study time with prayer. How does the spies' report in Joshua 2:24 differ from the original spies' report in Numbers 13:31-33?
2. When the Israelites come to Jericho, what is the state of the city in Joshua 6:1?
3. What is the battle plan for conquering Jericho as laid out in Joshua 6:2-5?
4. On the seventh day, the Israelites circle the city seven times and then shout, as the Lord had commanded. What happens in Joshua 6:20-21?
5. What happens to Rahab and why is she protected in Joshua 6:17 & 22-25?
6. Write out this week's memory verse below:

DAY 5

1. Begin your study time with prayer. Who acted by faith in Hebrews 11:31 and how do her actions demonstrate faith?
 2. What is Rahab's profession as listed in Joshua 2:1 & 6:17?
 3. Whose genealogy does Matthew 1:1-5 list, and who do you notice in verse five?
 4. Joshua 6:25 tells us that Rahab left Jericho behind and "lived in the midst of Israel" after it was conquered. Though she came from a sinful past, she left it behind and lived among the people of God. What do Isaiah 1:18 and Romans 8:1 say about God's ability to cleanse a sinner and free her from guilt and shame, regardless of her past? How does this challenge you to let go of shame and guilt in your own life and walk in the freedom Christ's death on the cross purchased for you?
 5. Write out this week's memory verse below:
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
