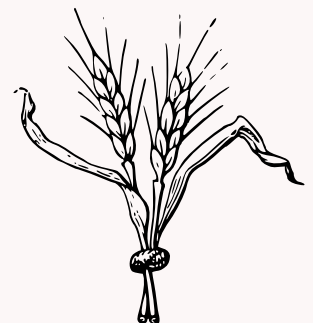

5. How does Ruth's faithfulness pave the way for the blessing God grants her? How is this true in your life as well?

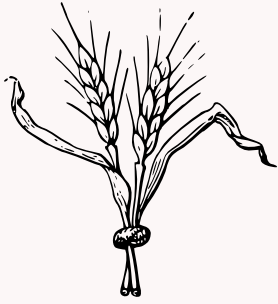

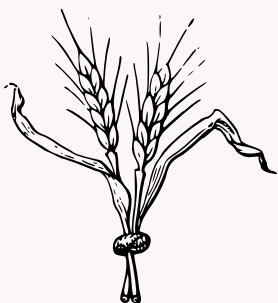
