INFINITE

Day 1

1. Begin your study time with prayer. What does it mean for God to be infinite?
2. How is this different from being extremely large or powerful?
3. Read Psalm 139:17-18, Isaiah 40:28, 1 Kings 8:27. How do these verses describe God's infinite nature?
4. Read Lamentations 3:22-23 and Psalm 136:1. How does God's infinite nature relate to His other attributes like love, faithfulness, and mercy?
5. Write out this week's memory verse on a notecard or a piece of paper and post it somewhere you will see it often (ex: bathroom mirror, desk, bedroom, backpack, etc)

Memory Verse:

“I am the Alpha and Omega,’ says the Lord God, ‘who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.”

- Revelation 1:8

Day 2

1. Begin your study time with prayer and read Jeremiah 32:17. Is there anything that God cannot do?
2. Read Psalm 139:1-6, Hebrews 4:12-13, and Proverbs 15:3. If God knows everything, does that include the future?
3. If yes, does that mean that God causes everything to happen? Including what we would consider to be evil or bad things? (Hint: James 1:13, Job 34:10, 1 Corinthians 14:33, Romans 8:28, and Matthew 5:45)
4. Read Psalm 139:7-10 and Jeremiah 23:24. How can God be everywhere all at once, and what does this mean for His relationship with creation?
5. Write out this weeks memory verse below.

Day 3

1. Begin your study time with prayer. If God has always existed and knows everything, how does this give us confidence that His plan to save us through Christ was perfect from the beginning and cannot be defeated?
2. Since God is all-powerful, how does this guarantee that Christ's work on the cross will achieve its intended purpose of saving believers?
3. If God is present everywhere at all times, how does this allow the Gospel's message of hope and redemption to reach all people, in all places, throughout all time?
4. If God is the same yesterday, today, and forever, how does this guarantee the reliability and truth of the Gospel message throughout history and into the future?
5. Write out this weeks memory verse below.

Day 4

1. Begin your study time with prayer. How should the reality of God's infinite nature humble us and expand our view of Him?
2. Read Psalm 145:3, Job 26:14, and Isaiah 55:8-9. If God is infinite, can we ever fully know Him?
3. How should this mystery shape our worship and devotion? (Hint: Jeremiah 9:23-24 and 1 John 4:7-8)
4. Read 1 Corinthians 10:31. How can we as finite beings, worship an infinite God in a meaningful way?
5. Write out this week's memory verse below.

Day 5

1. Begin your study time with prayer. How does God's infinite knowledge and power affect how we can trust Him with our lives?
2. How does God's infinite mercy and grace offer comfort and hope to His people?
3. Read Romans 1:20. How is God's infinite nature evident in His creation?
4. How does learning about God's infinite nature affect your personal relationship with Him?
