## WEEK THIRTEEN

### 2 TIMOTHY 4:16-22

#### DAY 1

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 4:16-22. What does Paul say happened in verse sixteen?
2. Can you think of a time in your own life where you felt “deserted” as you served the Lord? How did you feel? How did you respond?
3. How did Paul respond in 2 Timothy 4:16?
4. Some were ashamed to stand with Paul at his first defense. What does he exhort Timothy to do in 2 Timothy 1:8? Why does Paul say he suffers, according to 2 Timothy 1:8-12, and why is he not ashamed to do so?
5. How does Jesus describe true discipleship in Mark 8:34-38, and what warning does He issue for those who are ashamed of His name?
6. Write out this week’s memory verse on a notecard or a piece of paper, and post it somewhere you will see it often (e.g., bathroom mirror, car, desk, kitchen sink, etc.).

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## DAY 2

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 4:16-22. Though others abandoned Paul, who did not, according to 2 Timothy 4:17, and what did He do for him?
2. The Lord stood with and strengthened Paul to accomplish what work, according to 2 Timothy 4:17?
3. What did Paul resolve to do in 1 Corinthians 2:1-5, and how does he continue to live this out?
4. What do Luke 9:62 and Hebrews 10:37-39 say? How does Paul exemplify these verses, and how do they impact you?
5. Write out this week's memory verse below:

## DAY 3

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 4:16-22. Read Paul's words in Romans 8:31-39. What comfort would these truths have provided as he awaited execution? What comfort do they provide you?
  2. What did Paul write in Acts 20:24, Philippians 1:21-23, and Philippians 3:7-11, and how might these truths have shaped his perspective on his current situation? How do they impact you personally?
  3. What does Romans 8:28 say, and what "good" might God be working in Paul's life?
  4. Write out this week's memory verse below:
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## DAY 4

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 4:16-22. What is Paul confident of God in verse eighteen?
2. What promise do Matthew 5:10, Mark 10:28-31, Luke 6:22-23, and 1 Peter 4:13-14 hold for those who suffer persecution for Christ's sake? What should be our attitude toward it, according to these verses?
3. How does our future eternity compare with our present reality in Romans 8:18 and 2 Corinthians 4:16-18, and on what does Paul encourage us to focus even as we are afflicted? How would doing so impact your perspective and encourage your heart?
4. What, according to John 3:3-8 & 14-18, is required to be granted access to the Kingdom of God? In Ephesians 1:13-14, who is given as a pledge or a promise of the inheritance we will one day lay hold of? Are you certain of your eternal destination? If not, perhaps today is the day of salvation for you (see Romans 10:9-10).
5. Write out this week's memory verse below:

## DAY 5

1. Begin your study time with prayer, and read 2 Timothy 4:16-22. List the nine people found in verses 19-22?
  2. For some, this is the only time they appear in Scripture. Others, like Prisca (or Priscilla) and Aquila, are mentioned a few times. What else do we learn about them in Acts 18:1-3 & 24-26 and Romans 16:3-5?
  3. What is written about Onesiphorus in 2 Timothy 1:16-18, Erastus in Acts 19:21-22, and Trophimus in Acts 20:1-4 & Acts 21:27-30?
