Reports say that in 129 A.D. Pope Telesphorus ordained that the "Gloria" be sung at the Christmas Eve midnight mass. The phrase became known as the "Angels Hymn" and considered one of the earliest known Christmas hymns.

Luke 2:1 Now in those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus, that a census be taken of all the inhabited earth. 2 This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria.

3 And everyone was on his way to register for the census, each to his own city. 4 Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David,

5 in order to register along with Mary, who was engaged to him, and was with child. 6 While they were there, the days were completed for her to give birth.

7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son; and she wrapped Him in cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

8 In the same region there were some shepherds staying out in the fields and keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 And an angel of the Lord suddenly stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them; and they were terribly frightened.

10 But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people; 11 for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

12 This will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." 13 And suddenly there appeared with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

14 "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace among men with whom He is pleased."

15 When the angels had gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds began saying to one another, "Let us go straight to Bethlehem then, and see this thing that has happened which the Lord has made known to us."

16 So they came in a hurry and found their way to Mary and Joseph, and the baby as He lay in the manger. 17 When they had seen this, they made known the statement which had been told them about this Child.

18 And all who heard it wondered at the things which were told them by the shepherds. 19 But Mary treasured all these things, pondering them in her heart.

20 The shepherds went back, glorifying and praising God for all that they had heard and seen, just as had been told them.

Unlikely Audience - Shepherds

- A bit about shepherds
 - Social outcasts? Out of place maybe -
 - Shepherds were contemplative lots of wandering
 - Shepherds faced hardships dangers
 - Shepherds were not high on the social scale
 - God uses the ordinary to share the extraordinary!

Bethlehem is also known as the City of David. The city was David's family home (1 Samuel 16:1; 17:12)

Naomi, Elimelech and their two sons lived in Bethlehem before traveling to Moab during a famine (Ruth 1:1). It was to Bethlehem that Naomi returned after the deaths of her husband and sons, along with her daughter-in-law Ruth (Ruth 1:16–19, 22). To the east of Bethlehem lies the valley where Ruth gleaned in the fields of Boaz (Ruth 2:4). Boaz and Ruth were married in Bethlehem, where they also had their son, Obed, who was the grandfather of King David (Ruth 4:13, 17).

Tradition states that a cave under the church is the actual spot where Jesus Christ was born.

The manger site is marked by a star with the Latin inscription, *Hic De Virgine Maria Jesus Christus Natus Est*, meaning "Here Jesus Christ was born of the virgin Mary."





Church of the Nativity, built by Constantine the Great around AD 330, still stands in Bethlehem.


Unlikely Place - Bethlehem

- A bit about Bethlehem
 - Small town 9km south of Jerusalem
 - Insignificant in early days Census!
 - Bethlehem Ephrathah (eff ra tha) = 'fruitful'
 - God is not looking for great people to do great things – He seeks faithful people to do obedient things!


