Ruth - Kinsman Redeemer

6,7 So she went down to the threshing floor and did according to all that her mother-in-law had commanded her. When Boaz had eaten and drunk and his heart was merry, he went to lie down at the end of the heap of grain; and she came secretly, and uncovered his feet and lay down.

8,9 It happened in the middle of the night that the man was startled and bent forward; and behold, a woman was lying at his feet. He said, “Who are you?” And she answered, “I am Ruth your maid. So spread your covering over your maid, for you are a *close relative*.”

10 Then he said, “May you be blessed of the LORD, my daughter. You have shown your last kindness to be better than the first by not going after young men, whether poor or rich.

Ruth chooses wisely 9-10

- Naomi was unwilling to wait or trust – fix it!
- Ruth had demonstrated her virtue – chap 3
- Ruth is demonstrating her trust – *wings* – 2:12
- Ruth is demonstrating her choice – Boaz
- Ruth will demonstrate her obedience – *goel* vs 9

Ruth-Kinsman Redeemer

11,12 Now, my daughter, do not fear. I will do for you whatever you ask, for all my people in the city know that you are a woman of excellence. Now it is true I am a close relative; however, there is a relative closer than I.

Ruth-Kinsman Redeemer

Boaz knows better 11-12

- My daughter – relationship – family and familiar
- I will do as you ask – you are not unworthy
- ‘excellence’ – Prov 31
- I am ‘goel’ but there is a closer ‘goel’
- I must obey the Word – will you trust it?

13 Remain this night, and when morning comes, if he will redeem you, good; let him redeem you. But if he does not wish to redeem you, then I will redeem you, as the LORD lives. Lie down until morning.”

God knows best 13

- We do this right – may not go your way!
- Obedience is ‘God willing’ not ‘I am willing’
- If God allows – I will
- If God sends another – His will!
- Do we trust Him?
