1 John 4:7 Beloved, let's love one another; for love is from God, and everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God.



- "Beloved" – Greek (ἀγαπητός) a person dearly Loved and cherished. - "Love is from God" – God's Fingerprint is everywhere. - "Knows God" – Greek (ginōskō) to know in an experiential way.
