# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

• 3:10-11 NASB

10 Now you followed my teaching, conduct, purpose, faith, patience, love, perseverance,

11 persecutions, and sufferings, such as happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, and at Lystra; what persecutions I endured, and out of them all the Lord rescued me!

"The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

-- You have followed = you followed up on, reviewed, investigated, traced the steps of, confirmed personally

-- Rehearsed to the boy Timothy by mother and grandmother; validated by the adult Timothy through his research

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

#### 12 Indeed, all who want to live in a godly way in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

-Persecution of the godly is not out of the ordinary/a misadventure

- Accepted "Occupational Hazard"
- Medal of Honor
- Identification with Christ's Life = with His persecution as well

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

13 But evil people and impostors will proceed from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived.

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

-Neronian level persecution would not be the zenith of suffering

- The heat of persecution will inevitably rise with the progressive decay of pagan society

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

As good men (believers), by the grace of God, grow better and better, so bad men, through the subtlety of Satan and the power of their own corruptions, grow worse and worse. The way of sin is down-hill; for such proceed from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived. – Matthew Henry

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

14 You, however, continue in the things you have learned and become convinced of, knowing from whom you have learned them,

15 and that from childhood you have known the sacred writings which are able to give you the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

Paul calls Timothy to steadfastness despite:

- Persecutions he has seen Paul suffer
- The inevitability of persecution for all who would live godly
- The assured expectation that persecution will intensify

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

16 All Scripture is inspired by God and beneficial for teaching, for rebuke, for correction, for training in righteousness;

17 so that the man of God may be fully capable, equipped for every good work.

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

- Scripture =  $\gamma \rho \alpha \phi \dot{\eta}$  (graphē); writing
- Jewish culture = *The* Writings: The Hebrew Bible

# "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

Paul describes the Scriptures as being "inspired" (KJV)

- θε όπνευστος (theopneustos)
  - -- Theos (θεός): God, of God, pertaining to God
  - -- Pneo ( $\pi v \dot{\epsilon} \omega$ ): to breath, blow outward, wind
  - -- The Writings are breathed out by God/God breathed

### "The Soldiers Protection from the Peril of Apostacy

The words of the Scriptures, as written by their prophetic authors, are God-breathed; they are words that come to us from the very mouth of God – the very oracular speech of the Eternal Sovereign Creator of the Universe
