John 14:26

But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you.

Hebrew: ruah; Greek: pneuma, meaning wind or breath

In <u>2 Thess. 2:8</u> it means "breath," and in <u>Eccl. 8:8</u> the vital principle in man.

It also denotes the rational, immortal soul by which man is distinguished (<u>Acts 7:59</u>; <u>1 Corinthians 5:5</u>; <u>6:20</u>; <u>7:34</u>), and the soul in its separate state (<u>Hebrews 12:23</u>), and hence also an apparition (<u>Job 4:15</u>; <u>Luke 24:37, 39</u>), an <u>angel</u> (<u>Hebrews 1:14</u>), and a <u>demon</u> (<u>Luke 4:36</u>; <u>10:20</u>).

John 15:1-

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

⁹ "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. ¹¹ I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. ¹² My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command. ¹⁵ I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. ¹⁷ This is my command: Love each other.

²⁶ "When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father—the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father—he will testify about me. ²⁷ And you also must testify, for you have been with me from the beginning.

The words translated "spirit" and "soul," in <u>1 Thess. 5:23</u>, <u>Hebrews 4:12</u>, are habitually used interchangeably (<u>Matthew 10:28</u>; <u>16:26</u>; <u>1 Peter 1:22</u>). The "spirit" (Greek: *pneuma*) is the soul as rational; the "soul" (Greek: *psuche*) is the same, considered as the animating and vital principle of the body.
