THE PRICE OF LOVE

John NKJV 3:16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. 17 For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved.

1. PROPITIATION

1 John 2:1 My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. ² And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world.

Propitiation: The act of appeasing wrath or violent anger, Jesus satisfied the wrath of God that was against us, (JESUS CAME AND TOOK THE WORST PUNISHMENT FROM US)

2. REDEMPTION

Colossians 1:12 giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light. 13 He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed *us* into the kingdom of the Son of His love, 14 in whom we have redemption through His blood, 13 the forgiveness of sins.

Redemption: Repurchase of captured goods or prisoners; the act of procuring the deliverance of persons or things from the possession and power of captors by from bondage the payment of an equivalent; ransom;

3. RECONCILIATION

Romans 5: 10 For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. 11 And not only *that,* but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation.

Reconciliation: God brings man into a completely changed relationship with Himselffrom enmity and hostility and alienation to friendship, harmony, fellowship and family.
