

## January 28, 2024 - Sermon Discussion Questions

## **ICEBREAKER**

- 1. Do highs and lows from the last week!
- The topic for today is controversial, and we want you to have a productive and kind discussion. Before beginning the discussion, come up with 4-5 ways your group can discuss controversial topics in a way that honors one another and creates space to process it safely.

## **DIG A LITTLE DEEPER**

- 1. Review the message
  - a. Goals for two groups of people. LGBTQ+ people: to feel wanted in the church, to know what Jesus taught. Straight people: To love and welcome LGBTQ+ people, to know what Jesus taught.
  - b. Who am I? The loved and limited image of God. We must keep this as a primary identity and submit all other identities to it.
  - c. My created sex is part of being made in the image of God.
  - d. Marriage and sex matter because they are ultimately pictures of Christ and the church.
  - e. How do people grow? Grace + truth over time.
  - f. Principles for ministry: The Holy Spirit convicts of sin, God's kindness leads to repentance, people are not our enemies, and Jesus loved people who were nothing like him.
- 2. Out of the above list, what items come easiest to you? What items are the most difficult to understand?
- 3. Read 1 Corinthians 7:1-2, Genesis 1:27, and Matthew 19:4-5
  - a. Eric talked about how our primary identity is being made in God's image. What does this mean to you? Do you agree?
  - b. If someone asked you to define marriage based on these passages alone, how would you respond?
  - c. What could be the danger in finding our identity in places other than God
  - d. Read Ephesians 5:31-32. How does marriage and sex reflect Christ's relationship with the church?
  - e. How does Ephesians 5 rub against what culture says about sex and marriage?
- 4. Read Romans 2:4, Ephesians 6:12, Matthew 9:10-13
  - a. How do these passages inform how we love people with whom we disagree? How do these passages inform how we lovingly remind people of God's standards for life and living?
  - b. In what ways do you specifically struggle to love people who are different from you? What changes could these passages call you to make in your life?
