John 14:1-7

Day 1: Selfishness at the fellowship

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 11:17-22

Meditation: The first church started something called "agape feast" or "love feast". It was used as fellowship and to provide a meal for those who struggle to put food on their table. The main purpose was to show God's love to everyone. Yet the church in Corinth had started using it for their own personal gain. They would only gather around their people and would never spend time with anyone else. Always remember that anytime there is division in a church, it is the result of a much deeper problem.

Reflection: Have you ever been intentionally excluded from an event in the church? How did you feel? Have you ever intentionally excluded someone from something you were doing within the church? Why did you do that? What are some things you can do within your church to promote fellowship and remove division?

Prayer: Pray that you start to learn biblical math. Pray that you become a multiplier and not a divider.

Day 2: The Lord's Supper

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 11:23-34

Meditation: We as Baptists recognize two ordinances established by Christ: baptism and the Lord's Supper. When speaking of the Lord's Supper it should be a spiritually uplifting moment in our lives. Yet, the value of that experience is dependent upon the condition of each individual heart within the church. These passages speak very clearly on the serious offense of an unprepared heart. Always remember that the Lord's Supper gives us great opportunities for spiritual growth and blessings, if we are approaching it with the right attitude. Remember, next time you wonder why someone unjustly dislikes you, Christ chose to unjustly love you.

Reflection: Do you think it's ok to skip church if you know it is the Lord's Supper? When you hear that we are having the Supper, do you roll your eyes and wish we weren't? Have you spent time preparing your heart this week for this event?

Prayer: Ask God to show your true heart. Seek to soften your heart as you remember what Christ has done for you.

Day 3: Building Heaven

Scripture: John 14:1-7

Meditation: Christ knows our hearts. He knows that many times we create trouble within our heart. He is encouraging use here in this passage. Don't get upset, don't worry, because Christ understands you and He has gone to prepare a place for you the saved. In this week of remembrance, remember that one day we will experience everything in fullness

Reflection: What are your thoughts on John 14:6? Is it an encouragement that salvation really is that simple? When things are getting crazy, do you remember these verses? How might these verses help you into the future?

Prayer: Thank God for loving you and then ask him to show people that you need to love.
