



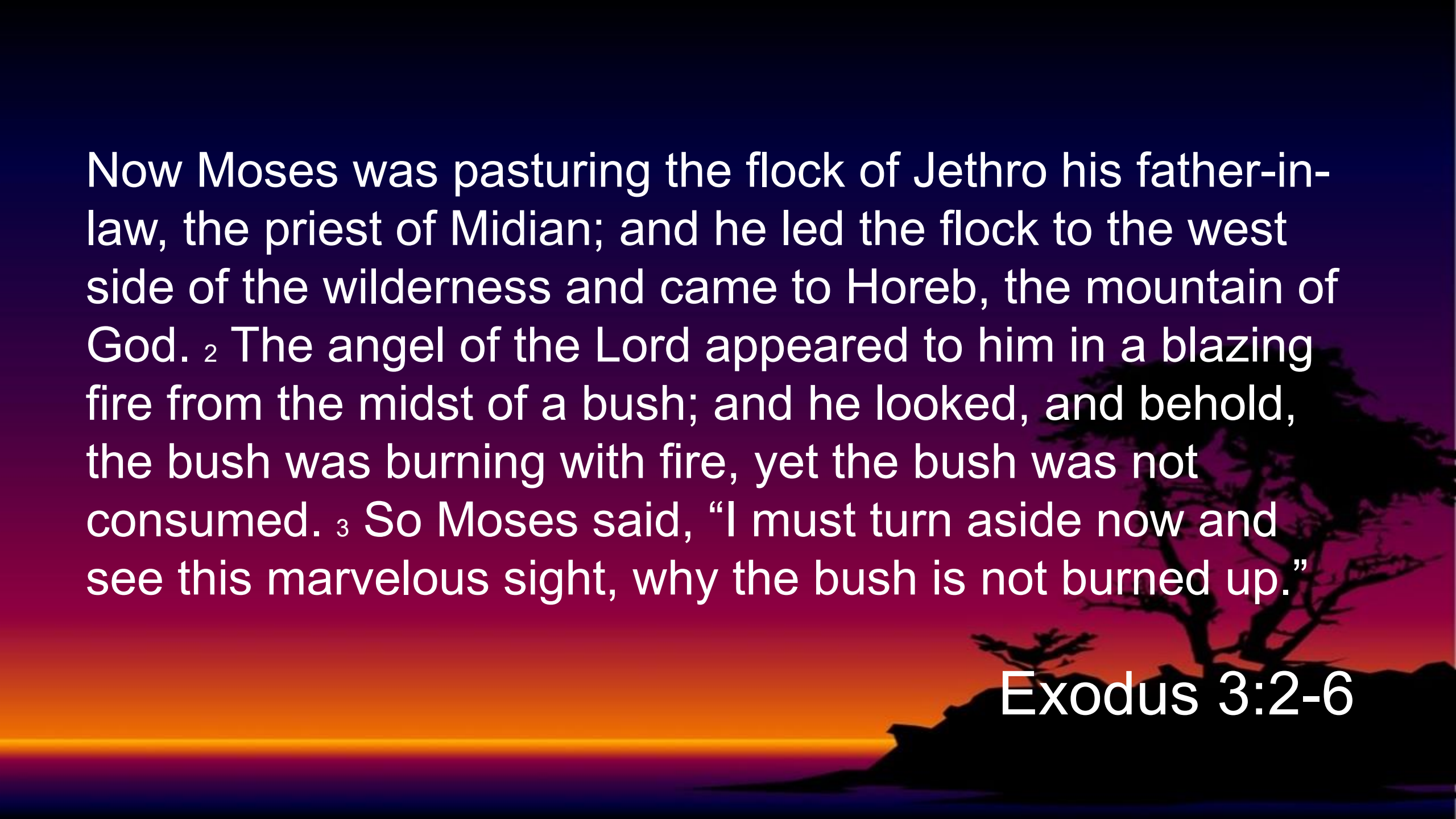
Bringing Us Together

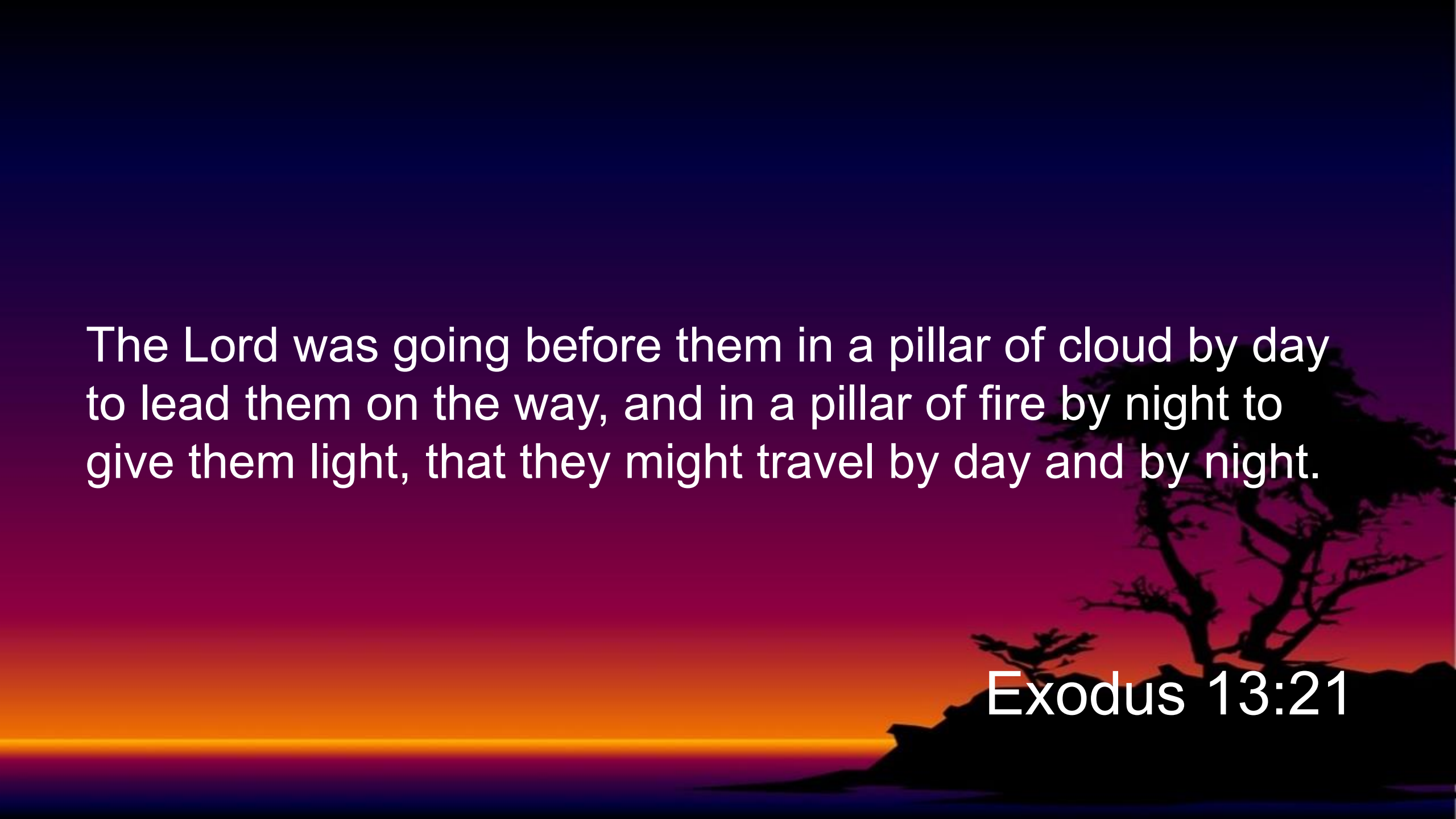

Exodus 3:2-6

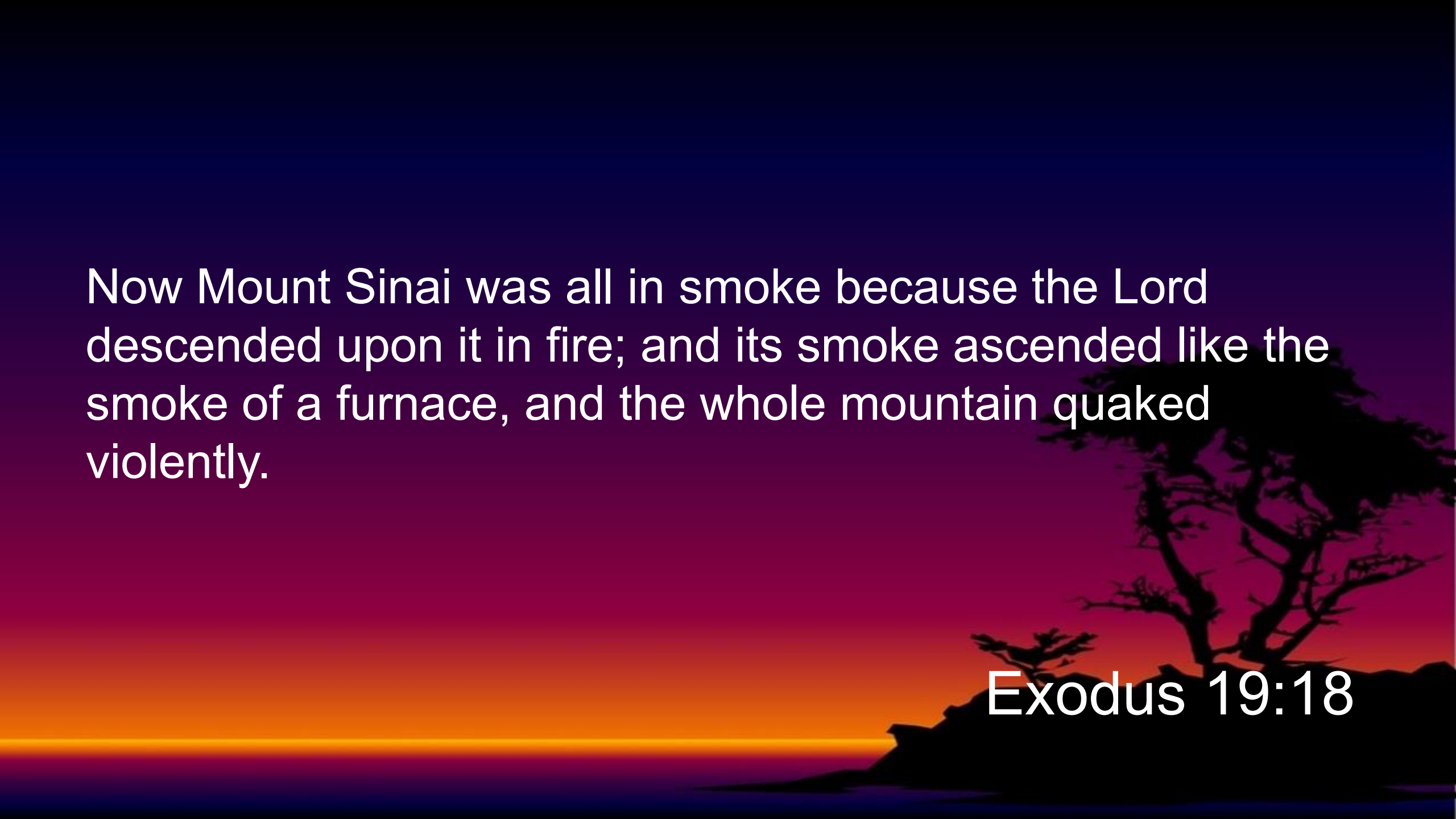

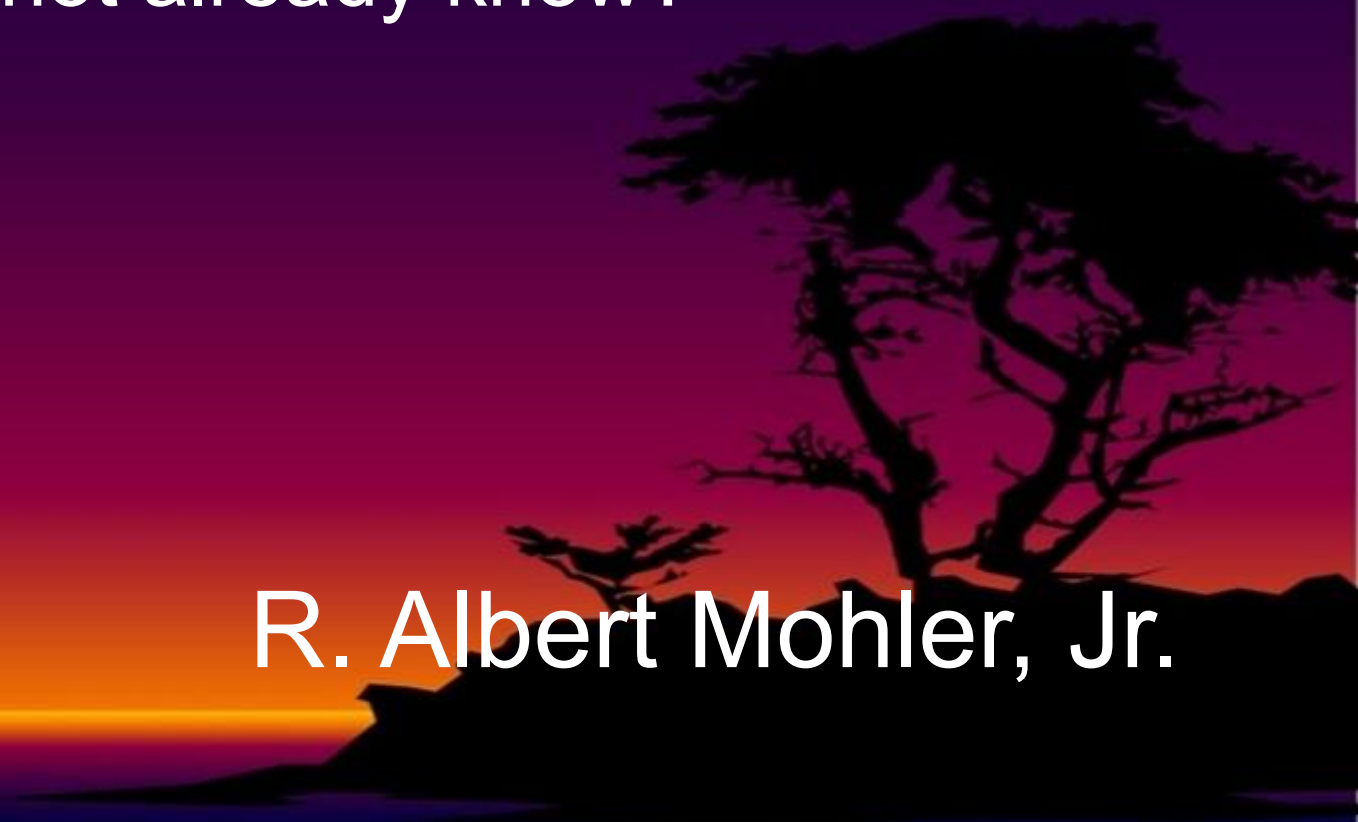

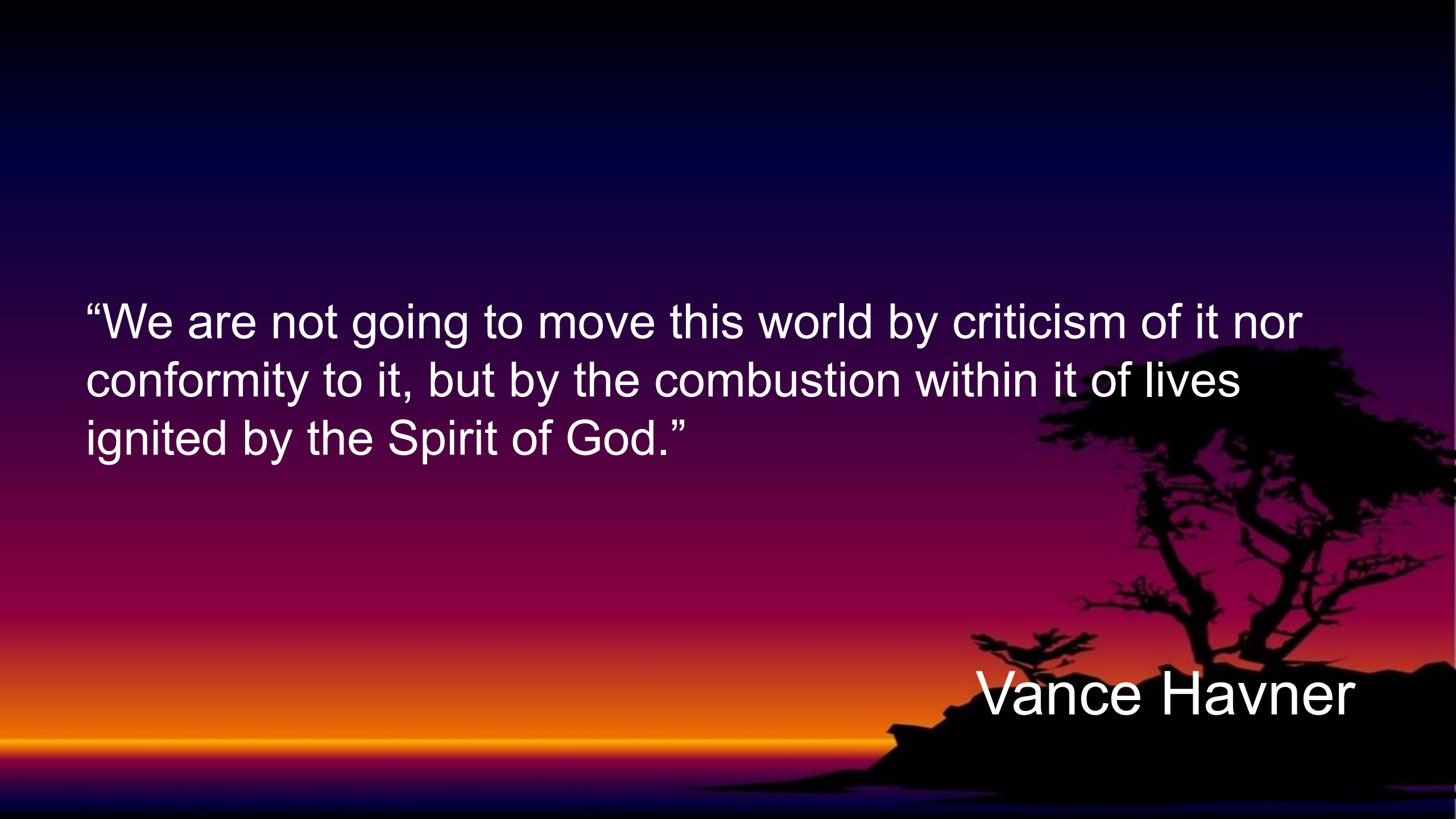
