43 Until I make Your enemies a footstool for Your feet.””



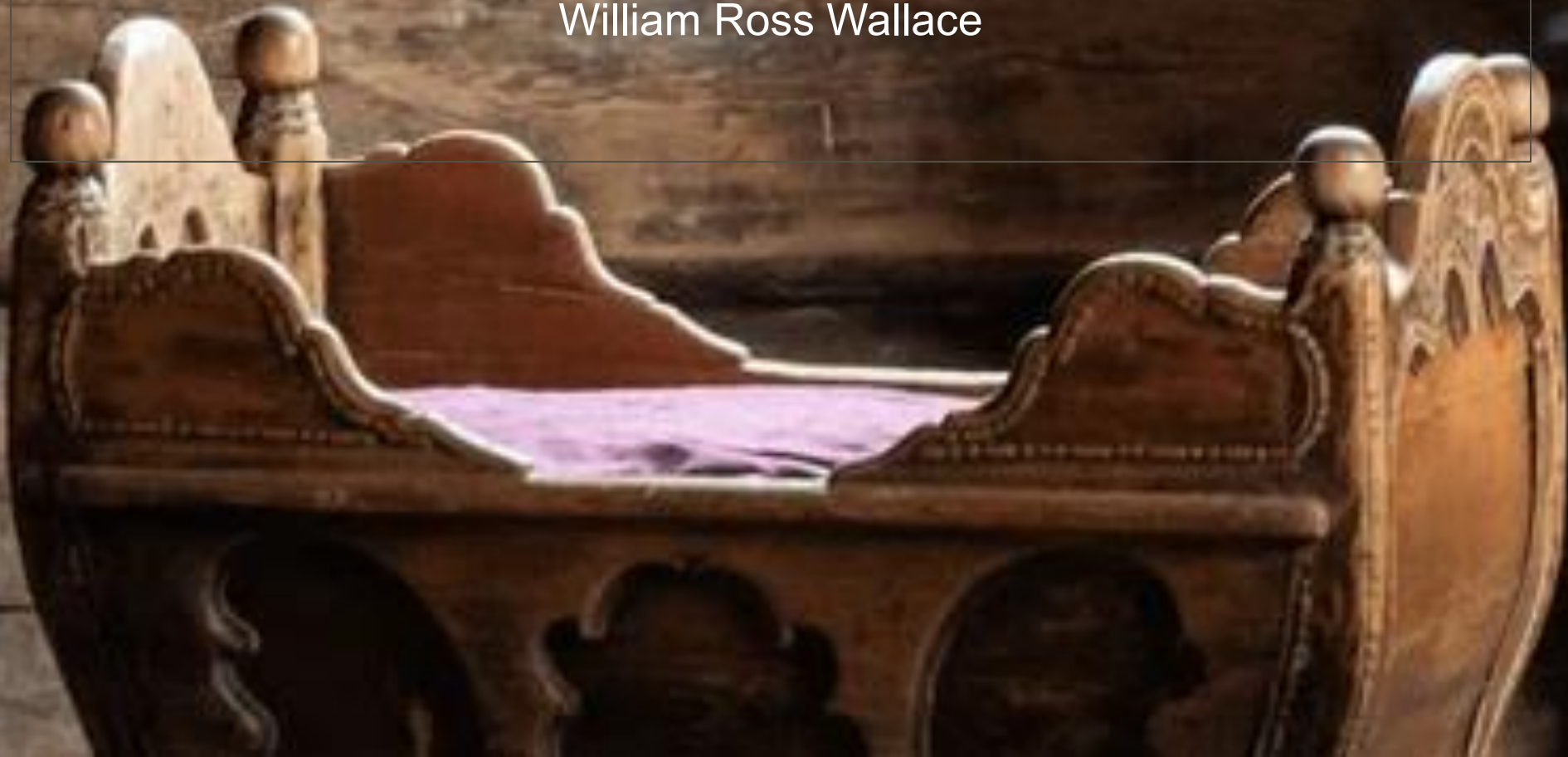
