

Key Verse

Ephesians 1.16 | I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers.

Application Questions

- Who is someone that you find yourself constantly thanking God for?
- Compare and contrast your prayers for other people versus Paul's prayer for the Ephesians here. Are the differences good, bad, or neutral?
- How can we experience more of
 God's power in our life? What does that even look like?

Life Questions

- Anything we can pray for this week?
- Anyone hurting around you that we can pray for or love this week?

Potential Discussion Questions

- 15 | Paul had heard of two things that made him give thanks to God constantly for the Ephesians. What were those two things?
 - Do people thank God constantly for you for those same reasons?
- 17 | After thanking God for them, Paul asks God to do what for them?
- 18-19 | Paul gives the three goals of them having "wisdom and knowledge of God." What are they, and which is most important to you?
- 18 | What does, "Having the eys of your hearts enlightened" mean?
- 18 | What is our inheritance?
- 19 | How do we see God's immeasurable power in our lives? Compare this to 2 Timothy 3.1-5. Do you feel like you experience the "immeasurable greatness of his power" or does God's working in your life seem not-so-powerful? Either way, why do you think that is? How can we experience more of God's power?
- 15-23 | How do you see the trinity in this passage?



Application Idea

What are the main points that Paul is praying for when he prays for the Ephesians?
