### What is the Rapture?

- 1 Corinthians 15:51-52; John 14:1-3; 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17
- 1. The rapture is for those who believe in the death and resurrection of Jesus. v. 14
- 2. The rapture begins with a pronouncement. v. 16
- 3. The Rapture brings us to the Lord forever. v. 17
- 4. The rapture will bring about our transformation.
- Philippians 3:20-21a

## The Rapture compared to the Second Coming of Christ

- 1. The rapture: Jesus comes in the <u>air</u> and <u>returns</u> to heaven (1 Thess. 4:17). The second coming: Jesus comes to the <u>earth</u> to dwell and reign (Matt. 25:31-32).
- 2. The rapture: Jesus comes to <u>reward</u> (1 Thess. 4:17). The second coming: Jesus comes to <u>judge</u> (Matt. 25:31-46).
- 3. The rapture: <u>believers</u> depart the earth (1 Thess. 4:15-17). The second coming: <u>unbelievers</u> are taken away from the earth (Matt. 24:37-41).
- 4. The rapture: <u>unbelievers</u> remain on earth. The second coming: <u>believers</u> remain on earth (Matt. 25:34).
- 5. The rapture: believer's are taken without <u>warning</u>. The second coming: other events <u>prelude</u> it.

#### When will the rapture occur?

- 1. The rapture happens immediately <u>before</u> the seven-year tribulation.
- 2. There is <u>no</u> mention of the <u>church</u> in The Revelation's description of the tribulation.
- 3. A post-tribulation rapture does not explain how the millennial kingdom is  $\underline{\text{populated}}.$
- Revelation 20:7-8a; Matthew 13:41-42
- 4. The epistles make <u>no mention</u> of Christians having to endure a coming tribulation.
- 5. The Thessalonian believers are grieved because they thought their friends and love ones missed the rapture.

# Why the rapture?

- 1. The rapture serves to preserve Christians.
- Revelation 3:10
- 2. The rapture serves to bring about <u>Israel's</u> repentance.
- Revelation 12:13; 2 Thessalonians 2:11-12

# Conclusion

- 1. Christians are to face death differently than those who do not believe. v. 13
- a. Death for the Christian is equated to sleep.
- b. The Christian's state of sleep should help us to not grieve.
- 2. Christians are to comfort one another with this truth. v. 18
