The Setting

- Daniel 9:20-22

Eight Questions

- 1. To whom is this prophecy directed? v. 24
- a. The prophecy is primarily meant for the nation of Israel.
- b. The prophecy is also meant for the city of <u>Jerusalem</u>.
- 2. What is meant by the phrase Seventy weeks? v. 24
- a. Seventy sevens refers you 70 segments of seven years.
- b. Seventy weeks = 70-sevens of years = 490 years.
- 3. What are the six prophetic events in Daniel 9:24 referencing? v. 24
- a. Group one: God's dealing with our sin.
- b. Group two: God's work to return the world to righteousness.
- 4. Do we know when the 490 year time frame begins? v. 25
- a. The 490 years begins with the edict to begin to rebuild Jerusalem. Daniel 9:25a
- b. The edict went out on March 14, 445 BC.
- 5. Why are the seventy sevens broken up into segments? vv. 25-26
- a. Seven weeks (49 years) the time it took to rebuild Jerusalem. v. 25
- b. Sixty-two sevens (434 years) the time it took to get to Jesus. vv. 25, 26
- Jeremiah 29:11; Isaiah 30:21
- 6. What happens after the first two segments? v. 26
- a. ...the Messiah is crucified. v. 26a

- b. ...the Messiah leaves without His kingdom. v. 26a
- c. ...Jerusalem is overtaken and the temple is destroyed. v. 26b
- d....<u>war</u> continues. v. 26c
- 7. When is this final week and who is being referenced in v. 27?
- 8. What is the purpose of the interval between the 69th seven and the 70th seven?
- a. God created a gap, a delay, for you.
- b. This gap is appropriately called the <u>Age</u> of <u>Grace</u>.
