Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew:

“Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.”

Academic Update:

Religion- Jesus Heals the Paralyzed Man; Jesus Calls Matthew; Jesus Calms the Storm

Reading – Concept: “-ed” (Rule: *Only appears on VERBS and means they are PAST TENSE.* “I say /t/, /d/, or /id/ but I write ed.” That is: "ed" says /t/ when after an unvoiced sound; "ed" says /d/ when after a voiced sound; "ed" says /id/ when after t or d)

Math –Lesson 16 – Making 9 (0+9; 9+0, 1+8; 8+1; 2+7; 7+2; 3+6; 6+3; 4+5; 5+4)

Literature – Billy and Blaze – Week 2

English –Chapter 7 – Prepositional Phrases; Classifying, writing and editing sentences

History - *Story of the World: Ancient Times* – Chapter 15 – The Phoenicians

Science – Transportation Unit: Trains and Planes

Math Homework: Practice "Making Nine" as many ways as possible (0+9; 9+0, 1+8; 8+1; 2+7; 7+2; 3+6; 6+3; 4+5; 5+4) *If I have 7 cookies how many more do I need to get 9? 2!*
Another way to refer to these sums are the "9 buddies," similar to last week.

Reading Homework: Read *King Hank's Trip* one page reader; I will send home red words (sight words) as well for them to “tap” and spell for you! Red Words: pull, done, sea, bay
