Welcome back after Presidents' Day! We hope everyone had a restful winter break.

This week, the scholars continued working on second declension neuter nouns in Latin. We started reading Dangerous Journey in literature. We worked on rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, and 1,000. In religion, we read more about Jesus' ministry. In history, we read about the Song Dynasty of China and the Coptic Orthodox Church.

The History/Science Fair is fast approaching. It will be held on Tuesday, March 3. We would like to thank you for your hard work in helping your child with this project. Mrs. Prestwood and I will work with the scholars on preparing their timelines for the posters and completing their posters.

The scholars will have their dress rehearsal on Monday, March 2. They will present their projects to the third grade classes to practice for their presentations for the History/Science Fair the next day. Scholars should bring their costumes to school on that day. They are to wear their uniforms to school, and they will change into their costumes for the rehearsal. The costumes will stay at school so the scholars can change into them on Tuesday morning for the History/Science Fair that is presented to the school. Costumes will be sent home after school on Tuesday in preparation for the evening event. Any props may be brought on Monday (if your child can carry them and their costume) or they may be brought Tuesday morning. The goal is for the scholars to have their speeches memorized by the dress rehearsal. Scholars may have their speeches written on index cards or a piece of paper if needed.

The History/Science Fair for the OSL community is at 6:30pm on March 3. Scholars are asked to arrive in their costumes and be at their stations by that time. They will recite their speeches to the visitors who stop at their stations. Scholars will be dismissed from their stations after 20 minutes so that they can visit the rest of the fair.
