The grade 6 scholars had an awesome first try at a Socratic discussion this past week. I hope that some of you heard about it at home! This kind of discussion is based on the literature reading and is predicated on students reading and answering questions BEFORE they come to class. These questions can be found at the back of the reading guides for each act.

For the actual discussion, 5-6 scholars sit in a circle and, as you might guess, discuss their thoughts and opinions. The scholars are given specific instructions about how to proceed in this discussion. For example, they must be prepared with questions answered, they must comment with support from the text, and they must acknowledge the speaker before them when they speak in the group. The scholars on the outside of the circle are listening and observing the discussion. They are noting who asks questions, who adds to the conversation positively, etc.
