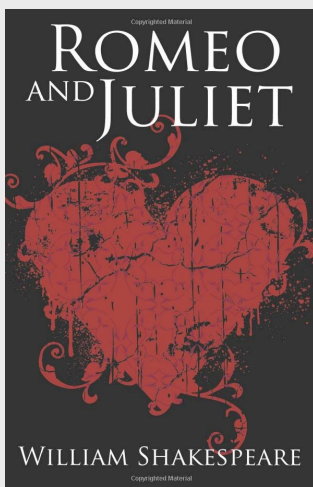

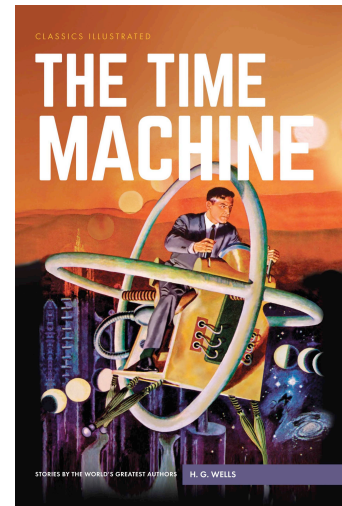

The Seventh Graders are studying the square of opposition. Statements have both Quantity (Universal or Particular) and Quality (Affirmative or Negative). We looked at five relationships between statements.

The Square of Opposition

Contradiction- Both Statements can NOT be True,

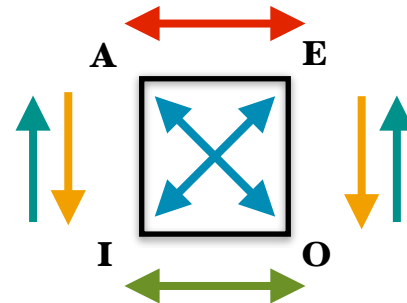
Both Statements can Not be False

Contrariety- Both Statements can NOT be True,

BUT both Statements CAN be False

Subcontrariety- Both Statements CAN be True,

BUT both Statements can NOT be False



Subalterns:

Subimplication- Truth of the Universal implies the truth of the Particular

Superimplication- The Falsity of the Particular implies the falsity of the Universal

Logic II

Ch.8 Disjunctive Hypothetical Syllogisms Quiz Thursday

Conditional Syllogisms is a syllogism that contains a conditional statement as its major premise, a categorical statement affirming or denying one of the elements of the conditional statement as its minor premise, and a categorical statement affirming or denying one of the elements of the major premise as the conclusion. A conditional proposition contains two elements: an **antecedent** and a **consequent**. The antecedent (if) is the grounds or logical reason for the consequent. The consequent (then) logically follows the antecedent. The Minor Premise affirms or denies something about the Antecedent or the Consequent.
