Please pay attention to page 2 of the newsletter for a running list of phonemes and lock words that have been taught and ideas on how to practice! Letter name and letter sound charts are a great way to reinforce the letter/sound connection with your child. Look for these in the phonics packet that comes home on Fridays. Rainbow writing lock words is great practice. Write each sound in a different color. For example, our lock word 'see' would have 's' written in one color and 'ee' written in a different color. We want to bring awareness to the sound/symbol relationship! If you are interested in more ideas to support phonics at home, let me know! We have finished Illustrated Stories from Shakespeare and have started James Herriot's Treasury for Children. Everyone liked Illustrated Stories from Shakespeare but Illustrated Stories from the Greek Myths is still the class favorite! They asked me to read it again. Lock Words

a, and, black, is, on, the, white, brown, said, see, stop, to, for, go, get, I, like, no

Parents, using a "tap, map, write, and read" routine is a great way to practice our lock words. Tap: Tap out how many sounds are in the word. This can be done with fingers or tokens. Map: If the word has 3 sounds, draw 3 lines or sound boxes. Then have your child write the letters in the box that correspond with that sound. Write: Have your child rewrite the word, making a list of all words practiced. Read: Have your child read the list of lock words they just practiced. Talk about word meaning and ask if they can use the word in a sentence!

This process helps facilitate orthographic mapping. Orthographic mapping is the mental process of storing words in long-term memory for instant retrieval!

The lock words for the upcoming week are highlighted.
