Memory Work

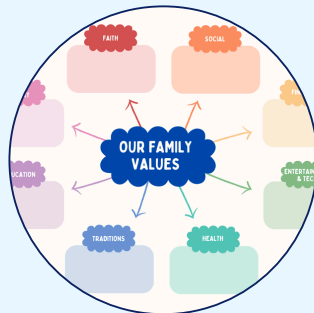

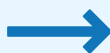
