Hello 2nd grade family! This week in English scholars learned the twenty-three helping verbs and how to classify interrogative sentences. We are nearing the end of The Courage of Sarah Noble in literature and learning how children can often teach adults to be brave. In reading they continued to work through the Picnic Chicken Basket rule with great success, and next week will move on to the Happy Rabbit rule.

In science the scholars saw an experiment dealing with the law of reflection and learned about Euclid. In history, they have been learning all about King Nebuchadnezzar and how he met God the hard way, about the strong faith and convictions of Daniel, and even got to read a few of Aesop’s Fables while studying him.

In math, scholars learned how to tell time using an analog clock. I encourage you to challenge them by asking them to help you read the clocks in your homes. They really enjoyed this unit!

We continue our memorization of the books of the Bible, Jesus’ public ministry, and studying our Learn by Heart in religion.
